As part of our ongoing discussion we are providing an update on your student's education and the next steps for student learning at ANSN School. I would like to ask your patience with us during this process. We are following guidelines by the Chief Medical Officer, AHS, FNHIB, ISC, Governing body of Alexis and Alberta Education. First and foremost, the safety and wellbeing of students and staff remains our top priority.

As Dr. Deena Hinshaw, Alberta Chief Medical Officer of Health said, *"There are no easy solutions to the situation we are in. We need to face this together, and respond to this extraordinary crisis with extraordinary kindness."* I have never been more proud of our staff and our school for how they are all stepping up to the challenge of online learning and working from home.

First, we would like to begin by thanking all the parents and guardians for your understanding and patience while we create and implement our Student Learning Plan. Your support is very important to our staff as they work to the best of their ability to compile a quality learning package for your child. I believe the following plan will support our students and families while learning from home.

Student Learning Support Information:

Note, provincial achievement tests are cancelled for students in Grade 6 and 9 and all Grade 12 diploma exams have also been cancelled. Students on track to receive 100 or more credits will still be eligible to graduate. Moving forward, [Alberta Education has shared their expectations](#) for student learning to continue. These expectations align with the programming plan we have set in place to maintain student learning.

Kindergarten to Grade 3 will focus on language/literacy and math/numeracy with an average of 5 hours of work per week.

Grades 4-6 will focus on language/literacy, math/numeracy, and some time spent on Social Studies and Science with an average of 5 hours of work per week.

Grades 7-9 will focus on Language Arts, Math, Social Studies and Science, with an average of 10 hours of work per week.

Grades 10-12 will focus on core courses required for high school graduation – which are English, Math, Social Studies, Sciences with an average of 3 hours of work per course per week.

Please note that every student will receive final grades and will receive a report card, appropriate to their grade level. All students who were on track to progress to the next grade will do so.

We will have student learning materials ready for all K-12 students as soon as possible. At-home student learning will be either online or in the form of learning packages. If you haven't done so already, please contact your child's school to provide you with access to the Parent Portal to monitor your child's progress online.
